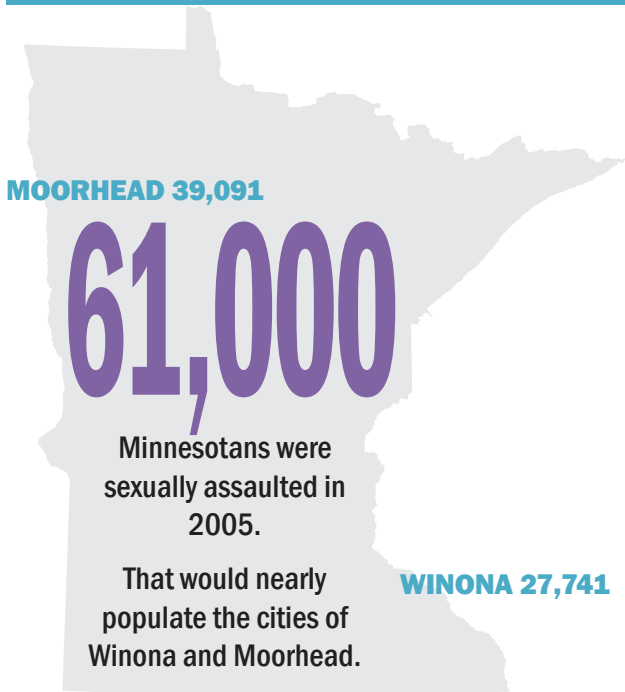


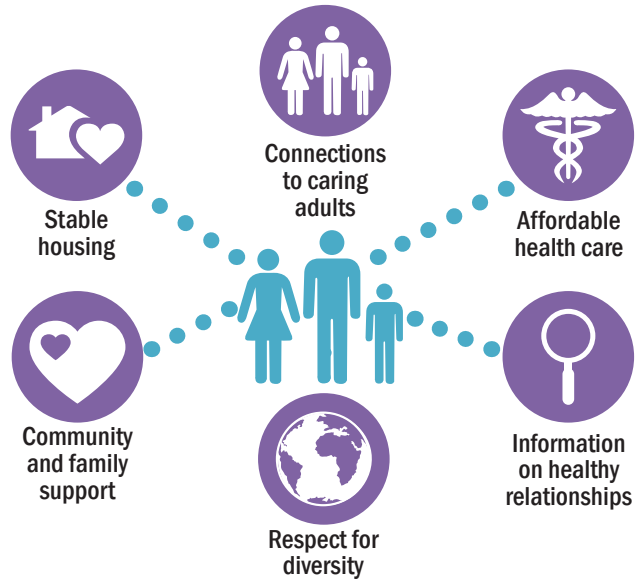
# SEXUAL VIOLENCE IS NOT INEVITABLE. IT'S PREVENTABLE.

By surrounding people with those things that protect health:

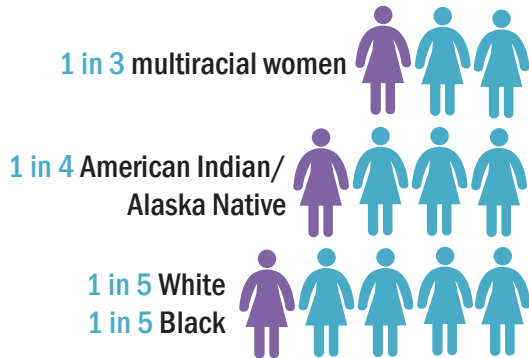


## WHAT IS MINNESOTA DOING?
