Talking points

- The new SCHSAC FPHR workgroup held three meetings. The workgroup has accomplished several items, including becoming organized (identifying workgroup agreements, principles and process for decision-making, communication and transparency), and developed a phased timeline and activities to accomplish the goal of developing a recommendation for a set of standards for implementation of foundational public health responsibilities that reflect what Minnesotans deserve from their public health system.

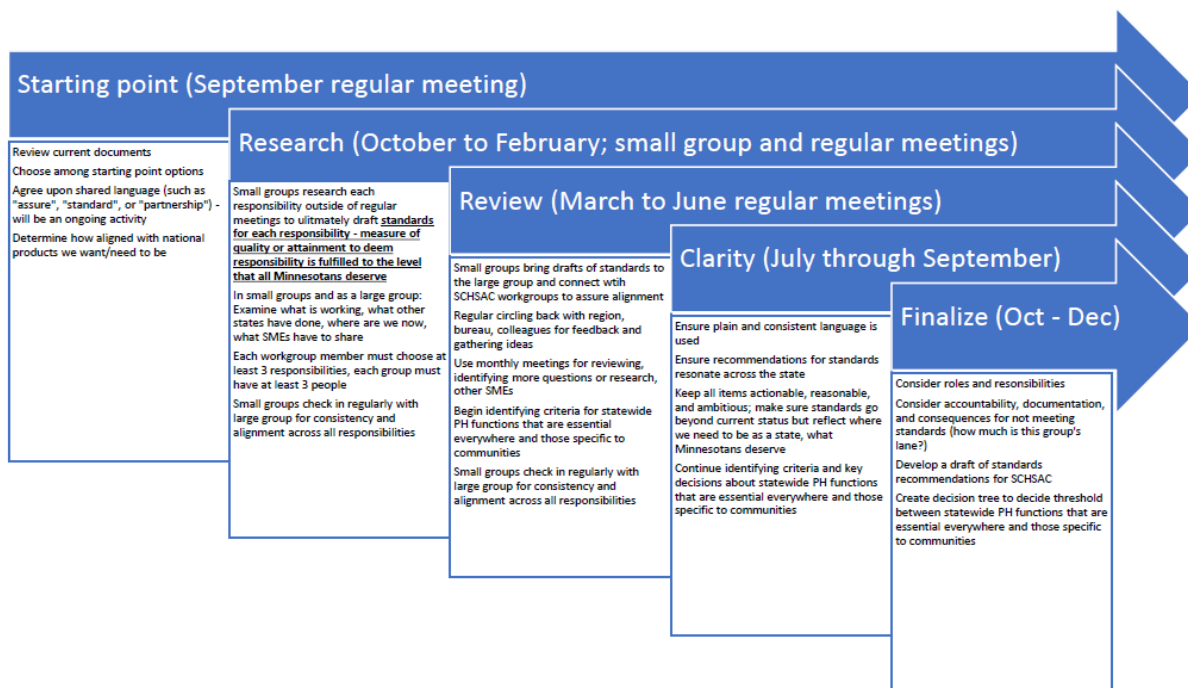
Workgroup members

Workplan and Timeline

During the August meeting, workgroup members identified activities needed to reach the goal of recommending standards by December 2025. The information was organized and placed in a phased workplan and timeline for members to review and consider. Members agreed to the workplan proposed with some minor clarifications. The workplan includes utilizing subgroups consisting of workgroup members and subject matter experts, organized around each of the foundational capabilities and areas. Workgroup members were asked to provide their preferences for which subgroups they want to be part of and asked to identify subject matter experts for any of the subgroups.
