# Minnesota Point-of-Care Ultrasound (MN POCUS) Project continues

The Minnesota Point-of-Care Ultrasound Project offers free ultrasound training to eligible providers through a grant by The Helmsley Charitable Trust.



This unique learning initiative has been very well received. Participants learn bedside ultrasound from a variety of modalities. Education is spearheaded by High Quality Medical Education (HQMedEd) and is delivered through online educational videos, an annual onsite day of training, regional conferences, and on-demand with the use of Butterfly TeleGuidance assistance.

Ultrasound skills such as EFAST, basic cardiac, DVT, and vascular access are taught. These skills will be reinforced and expanded by introducing clinical scenarios such as undifferentiated shock and chest pain, acute dyspnea, non-traumatic abdominal pain, and critical procedures.

## **Tertiary Review Meeting Tip**

Tertiary review meetings prompt good clinical care discussion that identify opportunities for improvement. Tertiary case reviews include provider discussion related to trauma clinical care. Documentation of these meetings must reflect the discussion, opportunities for improvement, and action plans with person responsible. <u>Sample Document</u>

Tertiary review meetings can be known by a number of different titles (e.g. Provider meeting, Trauma Committee, M & M) and often vary by hospital. To lessen confusion during the re-designation process, please use a consistent naming convention for your tertiary review meetings throughout your policy, flowcharts, and related documents.

## Regional Trauma Advisory Committee (RTAC) Corner

A highlight of the Western Regional Trauma Advisory Committee (WESTAC) meetings includes discussion of trauma cases for shared learning and how optimal care can be provided regardless of resources/trauma designation level. At the March WESTAC meeting, a case summary with key learning points was led by Dr. Meg Bowen with engagement from multiple agencies and trauma hospitals. Best practices regarding penetrating trauma with internal bleeding were shared.
