

How to Access MIIC Immunization Records for You or Your Child

The Minnesota Immunization Information Connection (MIIC) is a system that combines a person's immunizations into a single record, even if they were given by different health care providers in the state. Having access to you or your child's MIIC record can make it easier to share immunization information for many reasons such as health, school, travel, or employment. It can also be helpful when making informed health care decisions, like knowing when you or your child is due for a recommended vaccination.

You can access an immunization record for you or your child one of two ways. You can use Docket to download and print your own PDF copy of a record OR you can request a copy of a record by submitting a record request to the MIIC team using the MIIC Public Inquiry Form (<a href="https://redcap.health.state.mn.us/redcap/surveys/?s=Y3JCL3NDE7FPEXAM).

Option 1: Docket

Docket gives Minnesotans with a MIIC record an option to securely access their or their child's immunization history in MIIC through Docket. Docket can be used to:

- View immunization records in the app.
- See recent immunizations in the app within days.
- Share a PDF copy of their immunization record.

To get started, download the free app by searching "Docket" on the Apple App Store, Google Play, or at <u>Docket (https://mn.app.dockethealth.com/)</u> to use the web version. Option 2: Request a copy of a record

Minnesotans who would like to request a PDF version of an immunization record can also do so by visiting <u>Find My Immunization Record (www.health.state.mn.us/people/immunize/miic/records.html)</u> to submit a record request to MIIC.
